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1. Coping with the COVID-19 pandemic

As the world continues to hold its breath over the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, our hearts go out to each one of you that has been affected in one way or another.

There have been several confirmed cases of the Coronavirus in various parts of the country, especially here in the Coastal region.

As such, we've been forced to put on hold most of our programs particularly those that deal with field and outdoor activities. Consequently, this decision has kept away more than 6,000 girls from their safe spaces (football field).

Our thoughts are with all these girls and young women, like many other women globally who are at risk of sexual and gender-based violence.

We are reaching out to some of the girls for online counselling and through telephone calls to maintain vigilance and minimize the risk of associated with this pandemic. We are also maintaining this connection in our efforts to protect our girls and young women against exploitation and sexual and gender-based violence.

"I don't want any little girl to be alone when she experiences inequality"- Susie Petruccelli in her book, 'Raised a Warrior'.

Additionally, our coaches and staff are constantly engaging our girls, community members and other stakeholders through various platforms to equip them with the necessary information on how to protect themselves and stop the spread of COVID19, while remaining physically active.

2. Annual Registration of MTG Beneficiaries

Football is the cornerstone of MTG's programs, serving as the primary vehicle through which girls and young women get to participate and benefit from our activities. MTG's Annual Registration serves as the entry point for these girls and young women to participate in MTG's programs, especially in playing football safely within their respective community league fields in the company of their peers.

The registration process targets girls and young women between the ages of 9 and 25 years, and so far, has managed to attract over 6,000 girls to the program, before the local outbreak of the Coronavirus pandemic in March 2020.

Our football program not only acts as an avenue for girls and young women to improve their football skills but also provides a safe space, where they can discuss issues affecting them in the community.

Through this program, the girls are equipped with knowledge, tools and necessary resources for them to be able to understand, learn and claim their God-given rights. They are also taught how to to take up leadership roles and have a voice in society.

If you know of a girl in any of our 52 communities in the four counties who could benefit from such a program, please keep them informed and encourage them to take part in our next registration!

The **Global Goal 5 Accelerator** takes a collaborative approach to advance gender equality through soccer and sport-for-development organizations. This 10-month program addresses barriers for women and girls holistically: on the pitch, on the sidelines, in organizations, and the media.

As part of a regional cohort, organizational leaders and female coaches participate in an intensive in-person workshop focused experiential learning opportunities, sharing best practices, and creating organization-specific Gender Action Plans with commitments to advance their progress.

The GLOBAL Goal 5 Champions bring their learnings and action plans back to local communities, and are supported to accelerate their progress toward their Goal 5 commitments https://www.un.org/sustainabledevelopment/gender-equality/ We are excited to be participating in this meaningful movement!
